3 Start with people you know best

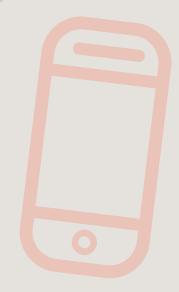
Get traction and build confidence.

"Joan, I'm getting ready to look for a new job and I need some help. Do you have any recruiters you could refer me to?"

Reach out to people you've lost touch with

Rekindle the relationship. Then ask for help.

"Greg, how are you? I made a resolution to be more connected, and wanted to see what you were up to. I'm still at Smith Bros Accounting Firm. I'd love an update."

Expand to people you don't know well, and ask to meet

Feeling confident? Time to broaden your reach.

"Maggie, we met as panelists at the annual networking event. I would love to connect and hear what you're up to. I think we may have some opportunities to join forces"



Use branding by association

Use your connections to get introduced to people or businesses you don't know.

"Rick, I know you're friends with Tom. I'd really like to meet him and see if there are any oppportunties to at his firm. Will you make an email introduction for me?"



Cold connect

Do research and then reach out.

"Susan, I've been reading some of your most recent posts on LinkedIn. You just wrote a piece on networking that was really provocative. Would you have time for a talk? It looks like we have a lot in common."
